### **Carrot Fritters**

Crispy and mild-flavored, this fun finger food always gets snatched up quickly. If there are any leftovers, they reheat well for a snack the next day. -Susan Witt, Fairbury, NE

Takes: 30 min. • Makes: 20 fritters

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 2 large eggs, room temperature
- ½ cup 2% milk

- 1 tsp. canola oil
- 3 cups shredded carrots Canola oil for frying Optional: Chervil or chopped parsley, and ranch salad dressing or sour cream
- 1. In a large bowl, combine flour, salt and baking powder. Whisk eggs, milk and oil; stir into dry ingredients just until moistened. Fold in carrots.
- 2. In a large cast-iron or other heavy skillet, heat ¼ in. frying oil over medium heat. Working in batches.

drop batter by 2 tablespoonfuls into hot oil. Press lightly to flatten. Fry until golden brown, 1-2 minutes on each side, carefully turning once. Drain on paper towels. If desired, top with chervil or chopped parsley and serve with ranch dressing or sour cream.

### **Asparagus & Green Beans** with Tarragon Lemon Dip



Tarragon balances the tangy flavor from lemon in the creamy sauce covering vibrant asparagus

and green beans. I serve this as a side dish as well as an appetizer.

Takes: 20 min. • Makes: 10 servings

- lb. fresh asparagus, trimmed
- lb. fresh green beans, trimmed
- cup mayonnaise
- cup lemon juice
- shallot, finely chopped

- 2 Tbsp. minced fresh tarragon or 2 tsp. dried tarragon
- Tbsp. minced fresh parsley or 2 tsp. dried parsley flakes
- 2 tsp. grated lemon zest Dash pepper
- 1. Place 1 in. water in a Dutch oven; add asparagus and beans. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer 3-5 minutes or until crisp-tender.
- 2. Meanwhile, in a small bowl, combine remaining ingredients. Drain vegetables; transfer to a serving platter. Drizzle with dip. **1 SERVING** 183 cal., 18g fat (2g sat.


### **Lemony Mushroom** Lasagna Roll-Ups

I love a classic lasagna, but I wanted to try something new: lasagna with a lemon ricotta filling. So I went to work in the kitchen and was happy with the results. I love making these roll-ups because they are easy to assemble —Debbie Glasscock, Conway, AR

Prep: 70 min. Bake: 45 min. + standing Makes: 6 servings

- 12 lasagna noodles
- Tbsp. olive oil
- lb. fresh mushrooms, finely chopped
- 1/4 cup dry white wine
- large egg, lightly beaten
- cups shredded mozzarella cheese, divided
- carton (15 oz.) whole-milk ricotta cheese
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese, divided

- green onions, chopped tsp. grated lemon zest
- Tbsp. lemon juice tsp. kosher salt, divided
- Tbsp. butter
- Tbsp. all-purpose flour
- cups whole milk Dash ground nutmeg Chopped fresh parsley, optional
- 1. Cook noodles according to package directions; drain and pat dry. Preheat oven to 350°. 2. In a large skillet, heat oil over medium heat; add mushrooms. Cook and stir until mushrooms are tender and liquid is evaporated, 6-8 minutes. Add wine, stirring to loosen browned bits. Cook and stir until liquid is evaporated.
- 3. In a large bowl, combine egg, 1 cup mozzarella cheese, ricotta cheese, 1/4 cup Parmesan cheese, green onions, lemon zest, lemon juice, 1/2 tsp. salt and mushrooms.
- 4. In a large saucepan, melt butter over medium heat. Stir in flour until blended; cook and stir until golden brown 4-5 minutes (do not burn). Gradually whisk in milk. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly; cook and stir until thickened, 2-3 minutes. Stir in remaining 1/4 cup Parmesan cheese, remaining ½ tsp. salt and the nutmeg. 5. Spread about 1/4 cup ricotta mixture on each noodle. Carefully roll up and place in a greased 13x9-in. baking dish, seam side down. Pour
- sauce over top 6. Cover and bake for 35 minutes. Uncover; sprinkle with remaining 1 cup mozzarella cheese. Bake, uncovered, until cheese is melted, 8-10 minutes. Let stand 15 minutes before serving. If desired, sprinkle with parsley.
